



QuarkViewer 1.0 ReadMe

QuarkViewer is XTensions® software for QuarkXPress® for Mac OS® and Windows®. QuarkViewer lets you export a layout in Microsoft® Silverlight™ format. You can then view the pages of the exported layout as a sort of interactive catalog in which you can turn pages, view thumbnails of the pages, and even zoom in for a closer look.

System requirements

Mac OS

Software

- Mac OS X 10.4 (Tiger®) or Mac OS X 10.5 (Leopard™)
- QuarkXPress 7.31 or QuarkXPress Passport® 7.31

Windows

Software

- Microsoft Windows XP (Service Pack 2) or Windows Vista®
- QuarkXPress 7.31 or QuarkXPress Passport 7.31
- Microsoft .NET Framework 3.0 Redistributable Package
- Web browser with Microsoft Silverlight 1.0 plug-in

Installing QuarkViewer: Mac OS

To install QuarkViewer for Mac OS, copy the "QuarkViewer.xnt" file to the "XTensions" folder in the QuarkXPress application folder.

Installing QuarkViewer: Windows

To install QuarkViewer for Windows:

- 1 Disable any virus protection software. If you are concerned about a virus infecting your computer, run a virus check on the installer file and then disable your virus detection software.

- 2 Double-click the Installer icon and follow the instructions on the screen.

- 3 When the **Select Installation Folder** screen displays, click **Browse** and navigate to the QuarkXPress application folder.

To verify that QuarkViewer is correctly installed, launch QuarkXPress and choose **Utilities > XTensions Manager**. The **XTensions Manager** dialog box displays. If QuarkViewer is correctly installed, the dialog box should list both "ProductManagerXT.xnt" and "XPressCom.xnt" as **Active**.

Uninstalling QuarkViewer: Mac OS

To uninstall QuarkViewer for Mac OS, remove the "QuarkViewer.xnt" file from the "XTensions" folder in the QuarkXPress application folder.

Uninstalling QuarkViewer: Windows

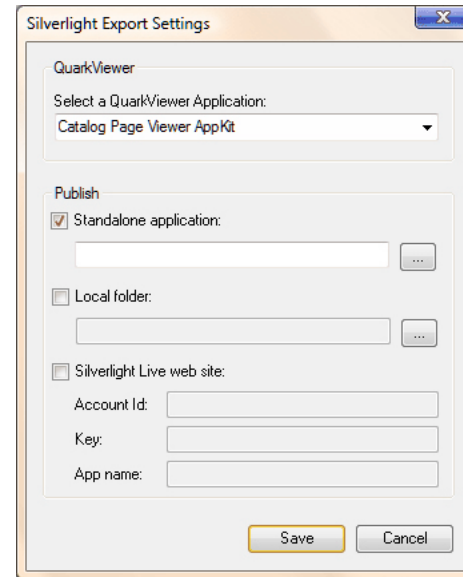
To uninstall QuarkViewer for Windows:

- 1 Choose **Start > Settings > Control Panel > Add or Remove Programs**. The **Add or Remove Programs** dialog box displays.
- 2 Select **QuarkViewer XTensions** and then click **Change/Remove**.

QuarkViewer export settings (Windows only)

To display the **Silverlight Export Settings** dialog box, choose **Edit > Silverlight Export Settings**. The options in this dialog box are:

- **QuarkViewer:** To indicate which application should be used to view exported layouts, choose an option from the **Select a QuarkViewer Application** drop-down menu. QuarkViewer includes the **Catalog Page Viewer AppKit** option, but future releases or third parties may supply other viewer applications.
- **Standalone application:** To save exported layouts as self-running executable files, check this box and then indicate where exported layouts should be saved.
- **Local folder:** To save exported layouts to your hard disk, check **Local Folder** and then indicate where exported layouts should be saved. Note that any items in this folder will be deleted when you export a layout.
- **Silverlight Live web site:** To upload exported layouts to a Silverlight Microsoft Live server, enter your account ID in the **Account Id** field, then enter your key in the **Key** field.

Preparing to export a layout

To prepare a layout for export in Silverlight format:

- 1 Create a Print layout and add four or more pages of standard QuarkXPress items and content.
- 2 Choose **File > Print**. The **Print** dialog box displays.
- 3 Choose **Microsoft XPS Document Writer** from the **Printer** drop-down menu.
- 4 In the **Device** pane, choose **Left Edge** from the **Position** drop-down menu.

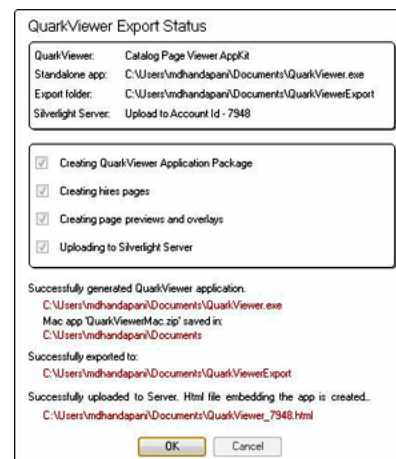
- 5 In the **Marks** pane, choose **Off** from the **Mode** drop-down menu.
- 6 In the **Preview** area, make sure that the page is completely within the paper boundary rectangle. If it is not, click **Properties** and increase the paper size for the XPS output. If your layout's page size is larger than the predefined paper sizes available, use the **Forms** tab of the **Print Server Properties** dialog box (**Start > Control Panels > Printers and Faxes > File > Server Settings**) to define a custom form that is large enough to accommodate your layout. (It does not matter if the paper size is much larger than the layout size, as long as the layout fits within the paper size.)
- 7 Click **Capture Settings**.

Exporting for Silverlight

To export a Print layout in Silverlight format:

- 1 Follow the instructions in Preparing to export a layout.
- 2 Choose **File > Export > Silverlight**. The **QuarkViewer Export Status** dialog box displays.
- 3 Click **Start Export**. The export process begins. When the export process is complete, the **QuarkViewer Export Status** dialog box displays the following, depending on the export options you selected:
 - A hyperlink to the exported layout folder
 - A hyperlink to the exported standalone application

- A hyperlink to the exported layout on the Silverlight Live server



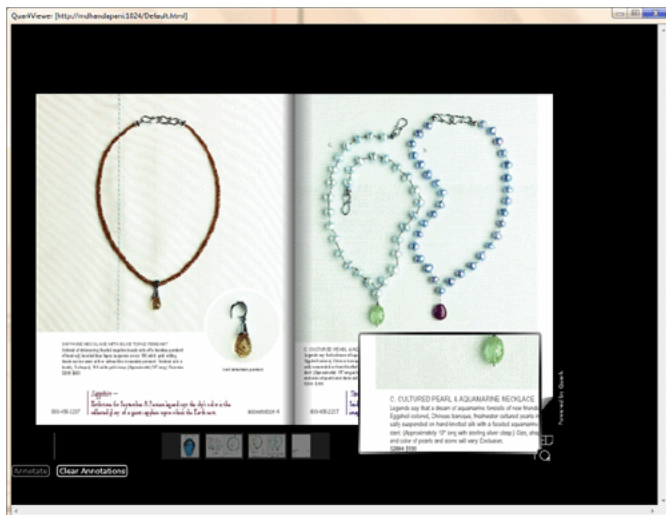
The **QuarkViewer Export Status** dialog box

NOTE By default, QuarkViewer does not upload the exported layout to a Silverlight server. Instead, QuarkViewer places the exported layout in the active user's default folder. You can configure QuarkViewer to upload to a Silverlight server and change the export location in the **Silverlight Export Settings** dialog box.

NOTE Some settings and options are available only on Windows.

Viewing an exported layout

To view an exported Silverlight layout, click the hyperlink that displays near the bottom of the **QuarkViewer Export Status** dialog box immediately after export.

If the exported layout contains more than one page, you can browse through those pages in the browser.

- To browse to the previous spread, click and drag the left page.
- To browse to the next spread, click and drag the right bottom corner of the right page.
- To display thumbnails, click the page thumbnail button. To browse to a particular page, click its thumbnail.

- To display a high-resolution view of the page at 2x magnification, click the magnifier icon on the right. To close the magnifier, click the magnifier icon again.

Limitations

QuarkViewer has the following limitations.

Features not available in Mac OS

- Export settings are not available.
- No XPS preparation options are available before export.
- Instead of an export status dialog box, on Mac OS you can only specify where to save the exported application.
- You cannot automatically upload the exported package to a Microsoft Silverlight streaming server.
- The magnification window is not supported.

QuarkViewer limitations

- Always close the magnifier window before you go to a different page.
- Do not export while viewing a master page; instead, navigate to a layout page before export.
